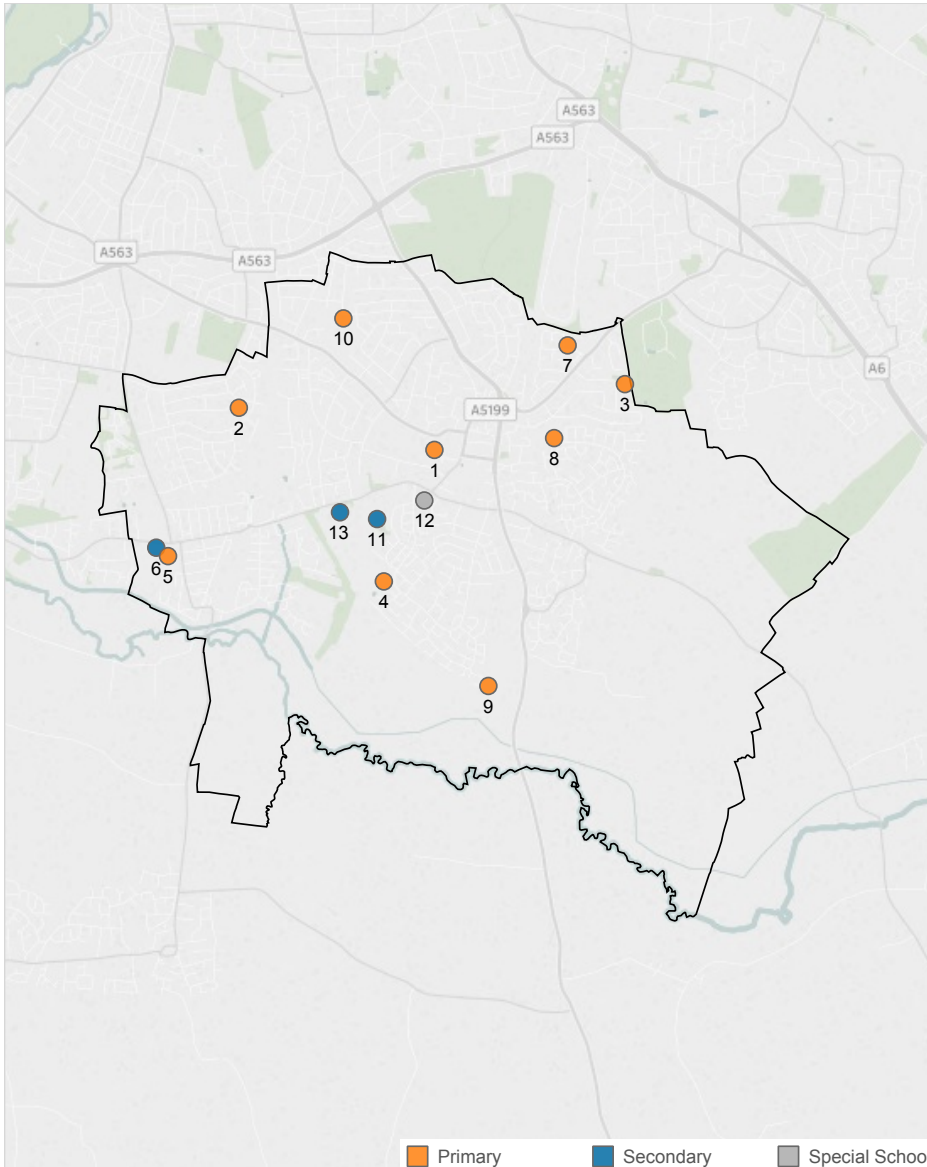


School Health Profile 2017/18

Key Statistics

The health of people in Oadby and Wigston is varied compared with the England average. About 12% (1,100) of children live in low income families.

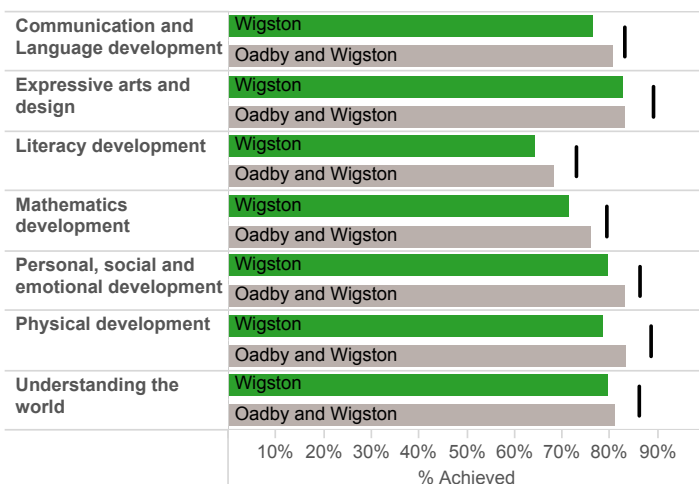
- Deprivation is lower than average in Oadby and Wigston and life expectancy for both men and women is similar to the England average.
- * The cluster has 9 primary and 3 secondary schools. 5485 pupils attend these schools and 51.5% are male.
- * The modelled percentage of pupils at age 5 achieving a good level of development in the cluster is worse than the England average.
- * In Reception, 228 children were classified as overweight or obese. In Year 6, this rises to 299 children (2013/14 - 15/16 collective).

School Readiness

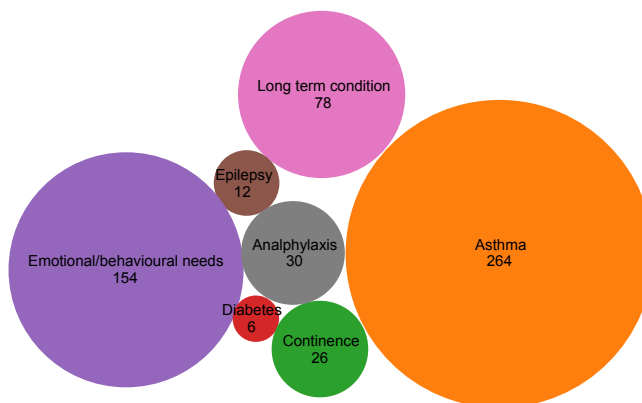
School readiness is a measure of how prepared a child is to succeed in school, cognitively, socially and emotionally. Just as there is an achievement gap in school performance, there is a school readiness gap that separates disadvantaged children from their more affluent peers.

School Health Profile

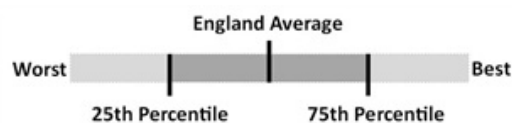
The school health profile will support schools to establish a clear and concise picture of health issues within the school and the wider community for children of all ages. The circles show the counts of pupils with medical conditions in the school cluster. The sizes of the circles are proportional to number of pupils with each condition. 83% of schools completed the return. Values of less than five are suppressed.



Child Health Summary for Wigston

The chart below shows how the health of children in this area compares with the rest of England. This area's result for each indicator is shown as a circle. The average for England is shown by the black line, which is always at the centre of the chart. The range of results for all local areas in England is shown as a grey bar. A red circle means that this area is significantly worse than England for that indicator; however, a green circle may still indicate an important public health problem.
