Official estimates of unemployment in the UK are obtained from the Annual Population Survey (APS) using the internationally agreed International Labour Organisation (ILO) definition. The ILO definition is based on the number of people without jobs who are looking for work. The APS unemployment figures which are subject to sampling differences are only available for Local Authority (LA) areas. The Claimant Count is released on a monthly basis and is available down to ward level, so is used as a more current indicator of unemployment levels.

# Super Output Area Claimant Count Analysis

Job Seekers Allowance (JSA) Claimant Count data is available for Lower Super Output Areas (SOA). SOA's are areas of broadly consistent population size across the country, each containing approximately 1,500 people.

The SOA resident-based unemployment proportions are calculated by Leicestershire County Council. They are calculated by expressing the number of unemployed as a percentage of the working age (16-59/64) population from the 2001 Census.

On the following page Claimant Count data has been mapped at SOA level. The map of Leicestershire County shows that in general the majority of areas within the County have very low Claimant Count levels (less than 1%). There does appear to be a pattern in the distribution of JSA Claimants across the County. Along the west of the County in the districts of Melton and Harborough unemployment levels are very low. There are more darker shaded areas on the County map up through Hinckley and Bosworth and up into the North/ North West of the County.

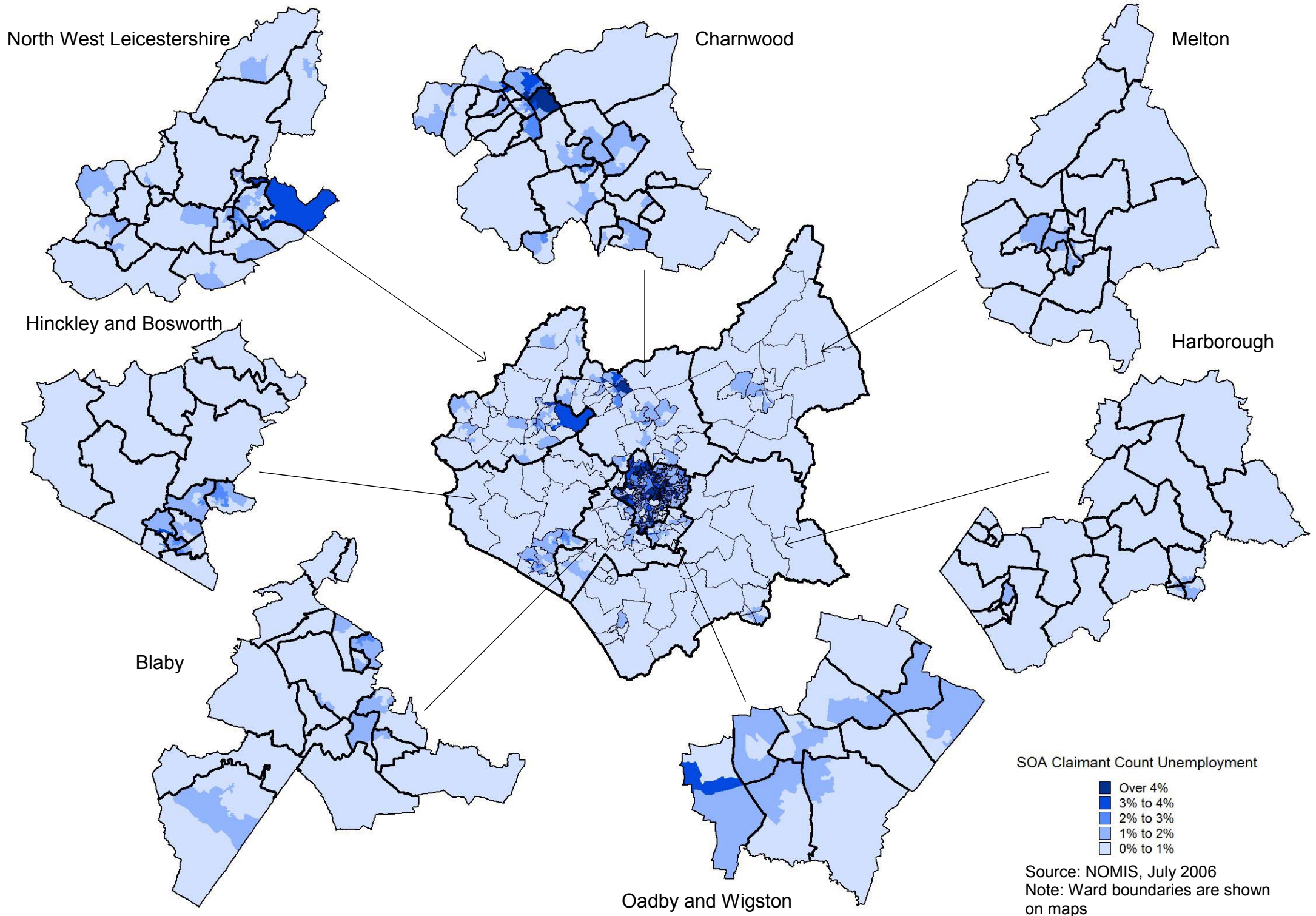
By mapping the data at SOA level we are able to see 'pockets' of high unemployment that are not visible when we look at district and ward averages. The ward of Loughborough Hastings contains the SOA with the highest proportion of people claiming JSA, with a rate of 5.6%, the overall ward rate is 5.8%. So although the district of Charnwood has an overall Claimant Count rate of 1.7%, pockets of high unemployment do exist in the district.

Oadby and Wigston district as a whole has a Claimant Count rate of 1.8%, however a Super Output Area within the South Wigston ward has a rate of 3.8%, with the ward overall having a rate of 2.9%.

## Leicester City SOA Claimant Count

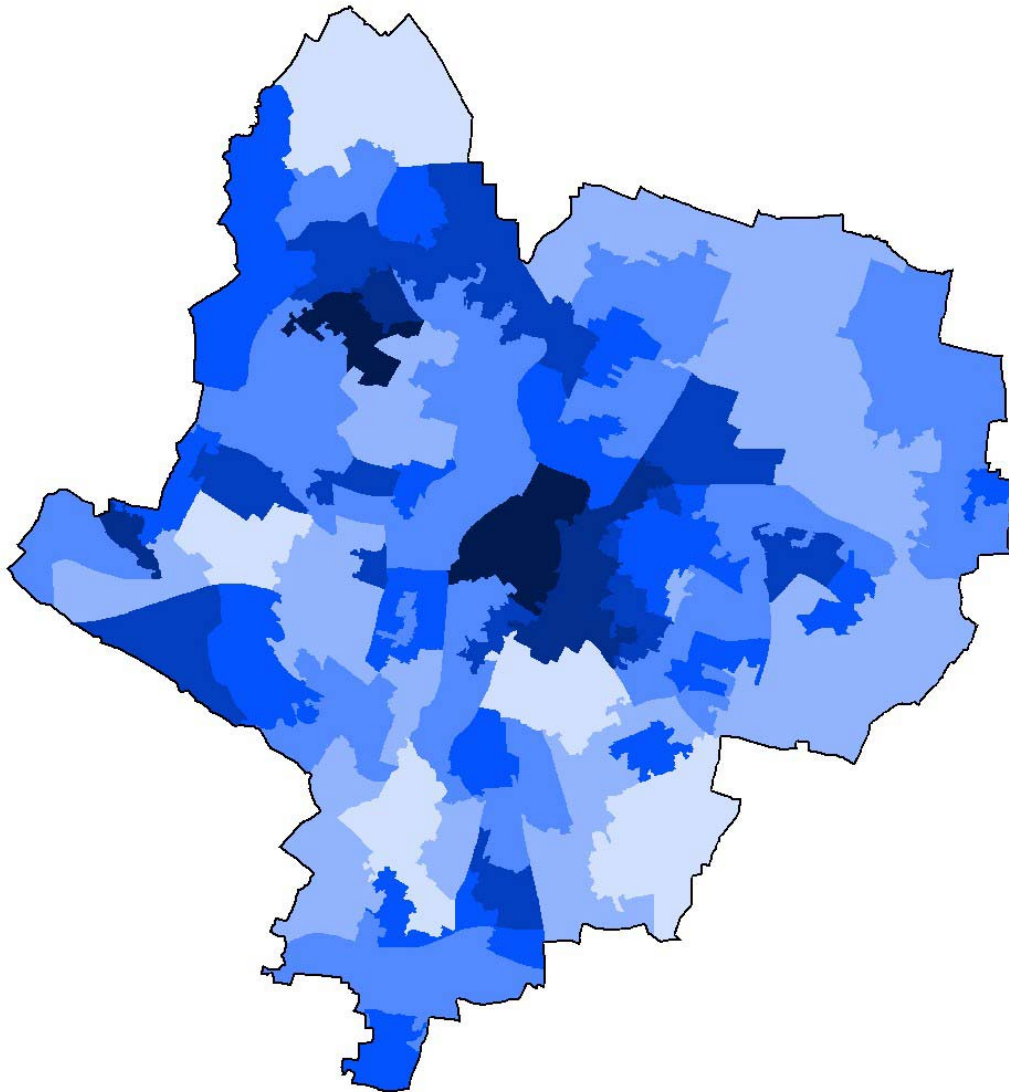
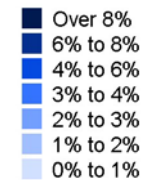


Table 2 below shows the ranking of the Leicester City top 10 SOA's by Claimant Count rate and the ward within which these SOA's lie. It can be seen that the wards of Castle, Spinney Hills and Beaumont Leys are the wards within the city that contain the pockets of areas of very high unemployment. The ward figures show that the ward of Charnwood has the highest overall Claimant Count rate of 8.1%, however none of the SOA's within this ward feature in the top 10 in Leicester City.
