Official estimates of unemployment in the UK are obtained from the Annual Population Survey (APS) using the internationally agreed International Labour Organisation (ILO) definition. The ILO definition is based on the number of people without jobs who are looking for work. The APS unemployment figures which are subject to sampling differences are only available for Local Authority (LA) areas. The Claimant Count is released on a monthly basis and is available down to ward level, so is used as a more current indicator of unemployment levels.

New Economic Baseline Study 2006

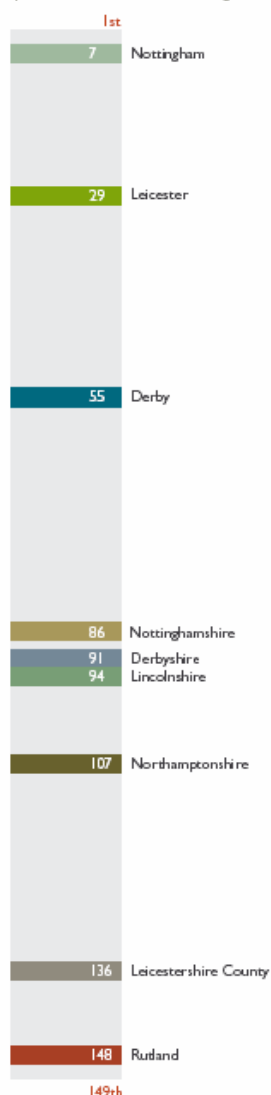
Social exclusion – a number of measures showing the barriers for certain individuals to participate in social, economic or political activities because of factors beyond their control. A focus on labour market exclusion is emphasised using deprivation and benefits data.

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 (IMD 2004) is a widely used measure which aims to capture the different aspects of deprivation affecting the individual. Deprivation is measured in seven key domains: ‘income’, ‘employment’, ‘health and disability’, ‘education, skills and training’, ‘barriers to housing and services’, ‘living environment’ and ‘crime’. Each domain is assigned a score, and then ranked nationally. These domains are then combined into an overall Index of Multiple Deprivation.

At a local authority level, the ranking is divided into two, with unitary and County authorities ranked separately from district authorities. The graphs to the right show that deprivation was much more severe in Leicester City than in Leicestershire County. Leicester City is the second most deprived County/Unitary Authority in the East Midlands behind Nottingham. The most deprived Local Authority District in the County was North West Leicestershire.

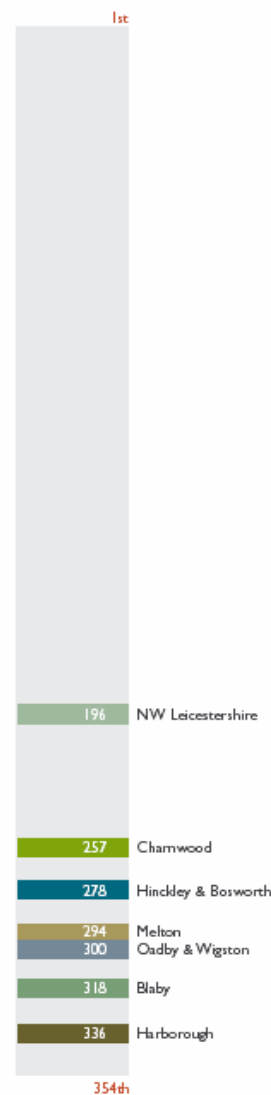
