


*This profile gives a picture of child health in this area. It is designed to help local professionals in government and health services understand the needs of children so they can work to improve children's health and reduce health inequalities.*

### Key Statistics for Ashby Cluster

- The health of people in **North West Leicestershire** is varied compared with the England average. Deprivation is lower than average and life expectancy for both men and women is similar to the England average.
- The Ashby cluster contains 23 schools, 21 primary schools and 2 secondary schools. 5,766 pupils attend these schools and 51% are male.
- The modelled proportion of children living in poverty is better than the England average.
- The modelled percentage of pupils at age 5 achieving a good level of development in the cluster is similar to the England average.
- The modelled percentages of children with excess weight in Reception and Year 6 are better than the England average.



# Child Health Survey Responses


## SHINT

# Child Health Summary

The chart below shows how the health of children in this area compares with the rest of England. This area's result for each indicator is shown as a circle. The average for England is shown by the black line, which is always at the centre of the chart. The range of results for all local areas in England is shown as a grey bar. A red circle means that this area is significantly worse than England for that indicator; however, a green circle may still indicate an important public health problem.
