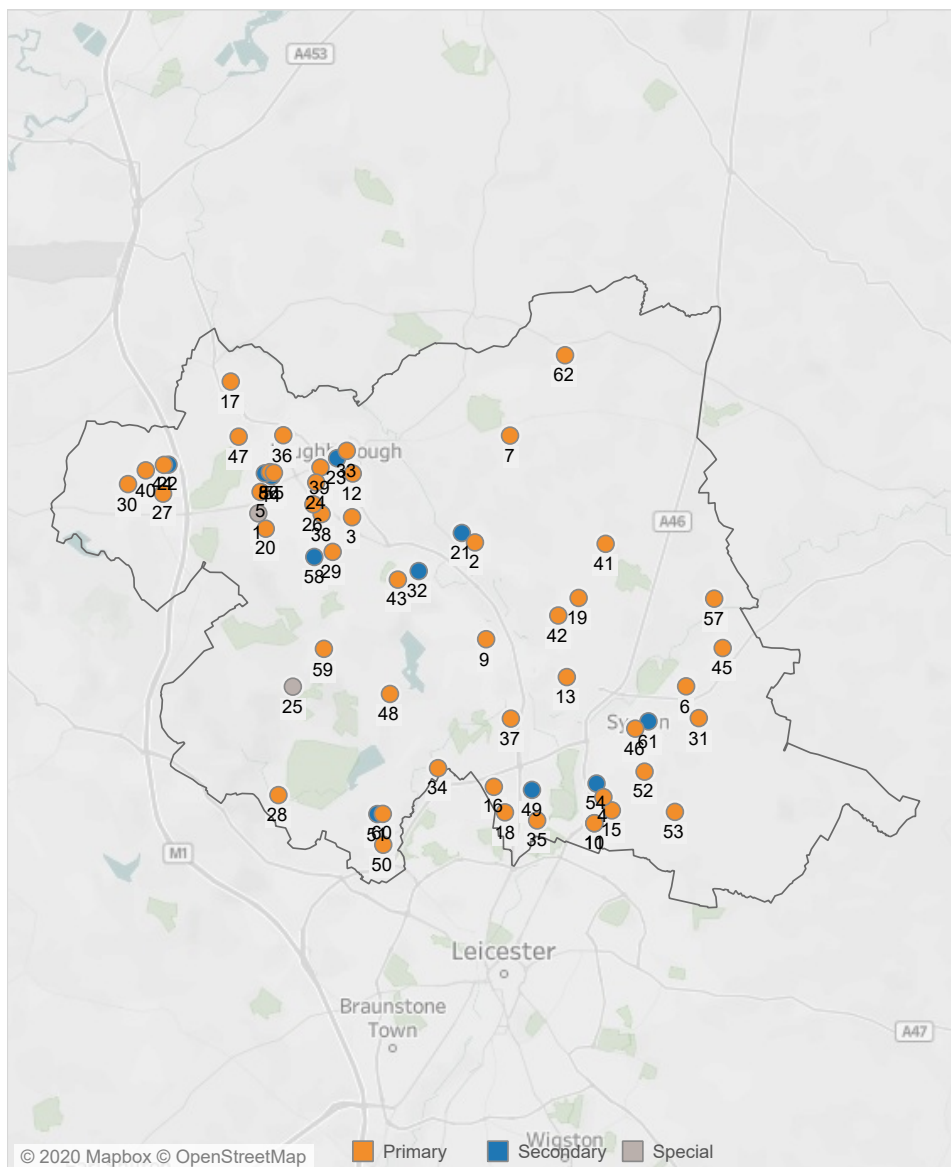


School Health Profile 2018/19

Key Statistics

The health and wellbeing of children in Leicestershire is generally better than the England average. The level of child poverty is better than the England average. Children in Leicestershire have better than average levels of obesity. In 2016/17, 22.3% of five year olds had one or more decayed, filled or missing teeth, this was similar to the England average. A similar proportion of children to the England average are judged to have achieved a good level of development at the end of the foundation stage. The teenage pregnancy rate is better than the England average.

- * Deprivation is lower than average in Charnwood and life expectancy for both men and women is better than the England average.
- * Although the proportion of children living in poverty is better than the England average, 3545 children still live under this circumstance.
- * Charnwood has 49 primary and 11 secondary schools. 22668 pupils attend these schools and 50.3% are male.
- * Hospital admissions caused by unintentional and deliberate injuries in children are better than the England average in 2017/18
- * In Reception, 400 children were classified as overweight or obese in 2018/19. In Year 6, this rises to 538 children.
- * Levels of teenage pregnancy are similar to the England average with 39 teenagers becoming pregnant in 2017.

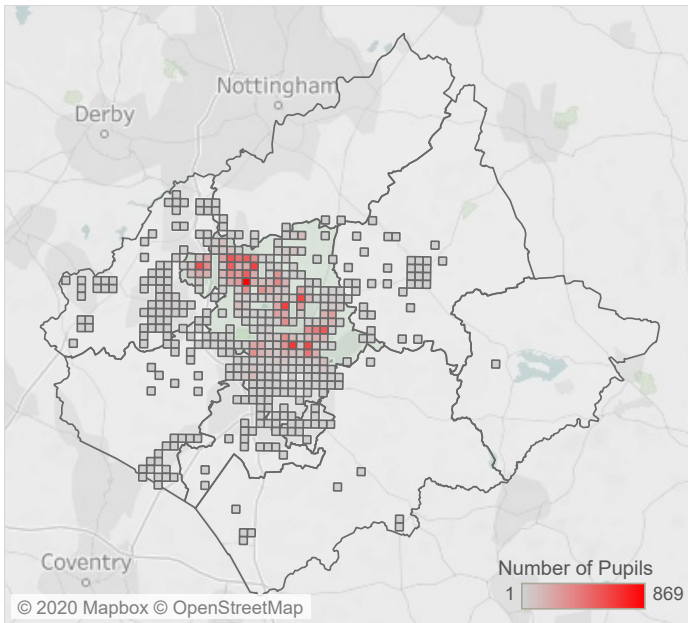

Child Residence

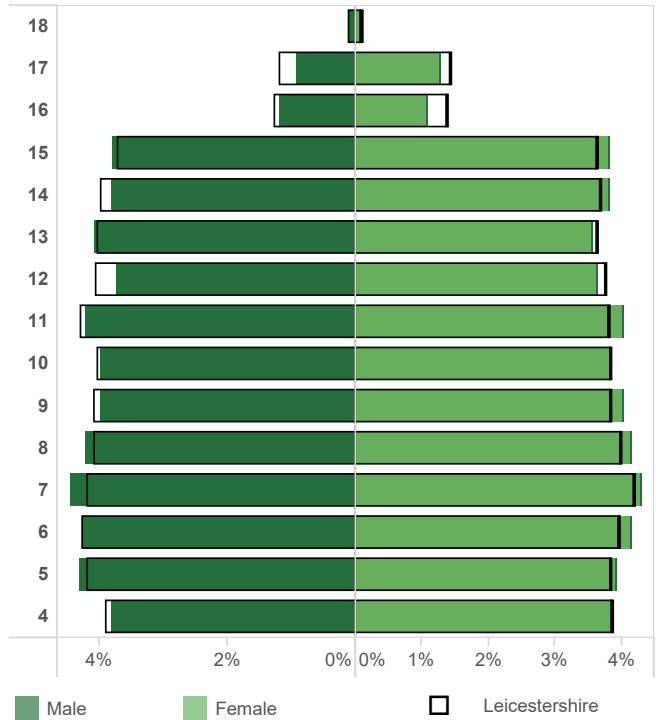
This map shows the child's residence of those attending schools in this area. Darker colour areas have the most children attending these schools.

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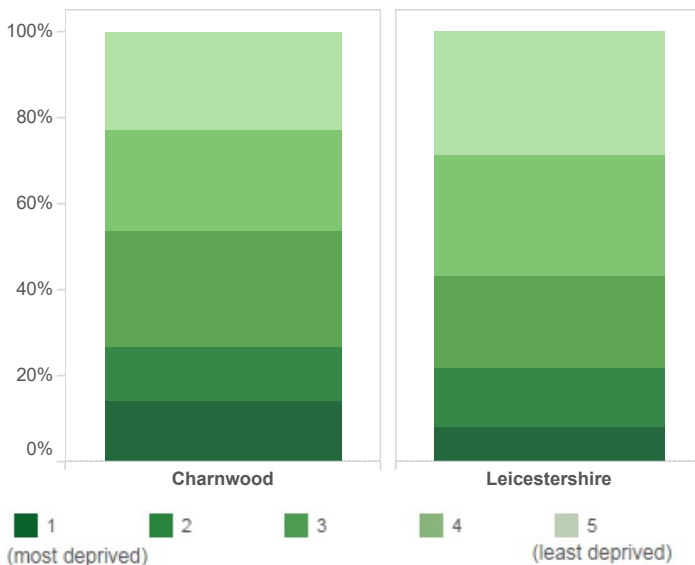
Age Profile

This chart shows the age profile of pupils attending schools in this area, compared to age profile of all school children in Leicestershire.



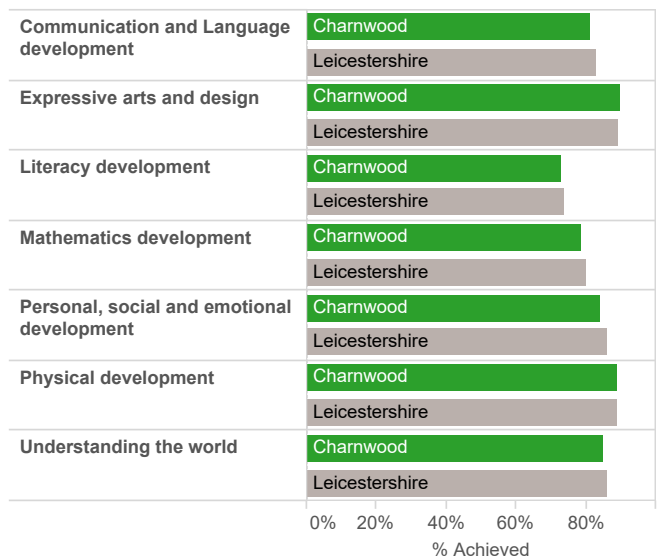
Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index

School Readiness

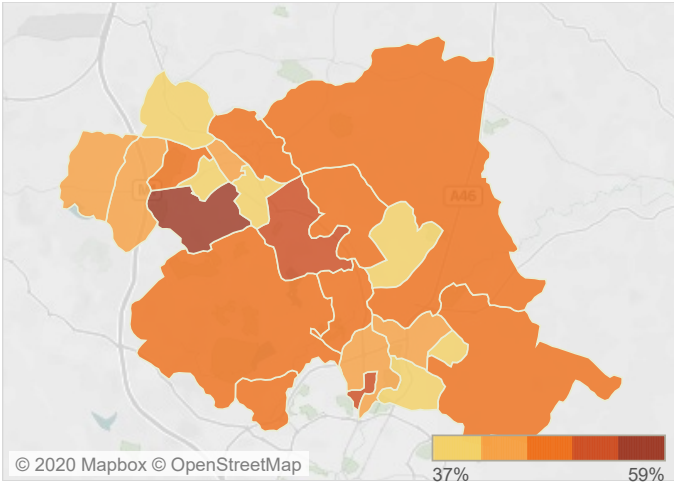

Just as there is an achievement gap in school performance, there is a development gap that separates disadvantaged children from their more affluent peers when being ready for school.

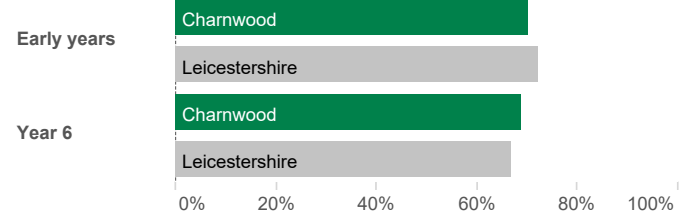

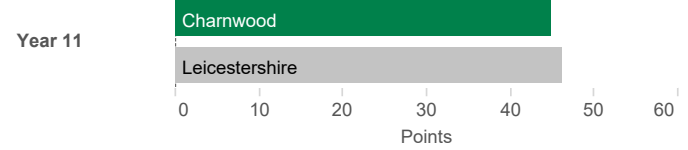
Educational achievement across school years based on district of residence

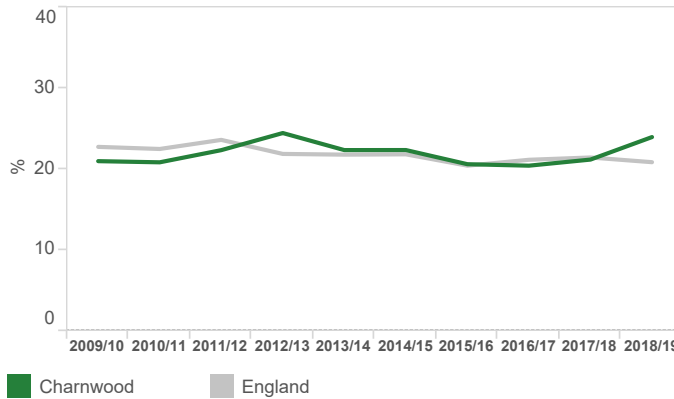

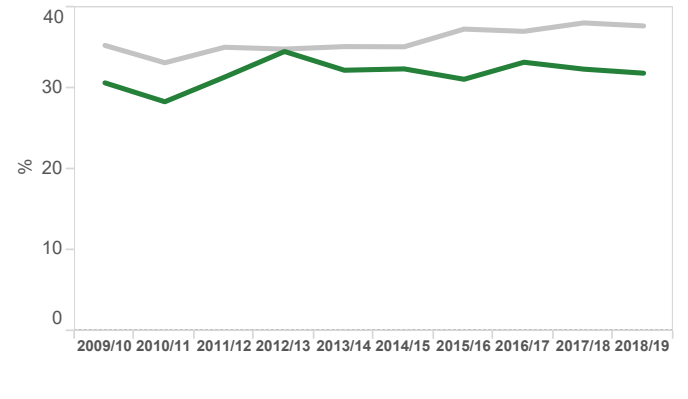

Reception Pupils: Percentage Overweight (inc. Obese)



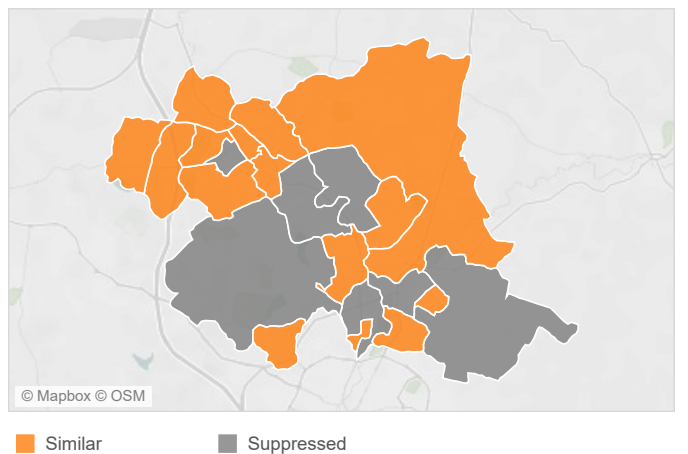
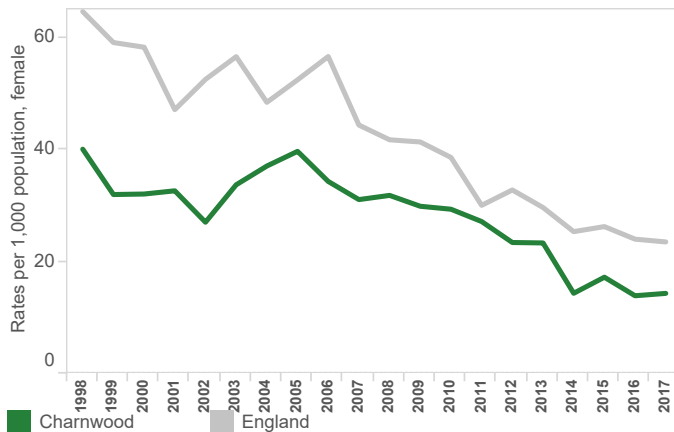
Year 6 Pupils: Percentage Overweight (inc. Obese)

Research evidence, particularly from longitudinal studies, shows that teenage pregnancy is associated with poorer outcomes for both young parents and their children.

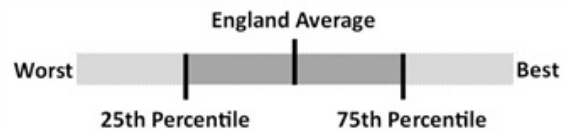
This map shows any significant difference in teenage pregnancy rates in this area compared to England at MSOA level.
