
School Health Profile 2018/19 **Hinckley and Bosworth**

Key Statistics

The health and wellbeing of children in Leicestershire is generally better than the England average. The level of child poverty is better than the England average. Children in Leicestershire have better than average levels of obesity. In 2016/17, 22.3% of five year olds had one or more decayed, filled or missing teeth, this was similar to the England average. A similar proportion of children to the England average are judged to have achieved a good level of development at the end of the foundation stage. The teenage pregnancy rate is better than the England average.

- * Deprivation is lower than average in Hinckley and Bosworth and life expectancy for both men and women is better than the England
- Although the proportion of children living in poverty is better than the England average, 2025 children still live under this circumstance.
- Hinckley and Bosworth has 33 primary and 10 secondary schools. 17642 pupils attend these schools and 51.2% are male.
- Hospital admissions caused by unintentional and deliberate injuries in children are similar to the England average in 2017/18
- In Reception, 220 children were classified as overweight or obese in 2018/19. In Year 6, this rises to 334 children.
- Levels of teenage pregnancy are better than the England average, however 18 teenagers became pregnant in 2017.


This map shows the child's residence of those attending schools in this area. Darker colour areas have the most children attending these schools.


Age Profile

This chart shows the age profile of pupils attending schools in this area, compared to age profile of all school children in Leicestershire.




Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index

School Readiness

School readiness is a measure of how prepared a child is to succeed in school, cognitively, socially and emotionally. Just as there is an achievement gap in school performance, there is a development gap that separates disadvantaged children from their more affluent peers when being ready for school.


Attainment 8 Map



Early years: % of pupils achieving a good level of development Year 6: % of pupils achieving the expected level in English and Maths Year 11: Students measure of achievement across eight subjects





Teenage Pregnancy (aged 15-17 years)


Research evidence, particularly from longitudinal studies, shows that teenage pregnancy is associated with poorer outcomes for both young parents and their children.
